What I said there is a traditional protocol greeting. I said, Hello/greetings all of relatives!

Biidasinookwe is my Spirit name, Anna Martineau-Merritt is what I am called. Migizi (Eagle) is my clan/family, and I am from Miskwaabikaang /Red Cliff and Iron River is where I live nowadays.



Descriptions you may see:

Anishinaabe(g) (original people(s)) is what the Ojibwe nation calls themselves.

Red Cliff Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians (legal description)

Chippewa/Ochippewa/Ojibaway/Ojibwa/Ojibwe, are all names that others call the Anishinaabe(g).


Our culture is very complex and yet, very simple

- Verb based language/thought process
- Genderless language
- ❖ Learning is from gichi-aya'aa (elder)/aadizookewinini (storyteller) through
 - Stories why and how we do things a certain way
 - Sacred stories also called Wenabozho stories (can only be told at certain times)
- Spirit based lifestyle
- Spiritual/Spirit based faith

- ➤ Aki Earth (earth/land/ground)
- ➤ Giizis Sun. The sun is also known as Mishomis, our grandfather
- ➤ Dibikaa Giizis Moon . The moon is also known to us as Nookomis, our grandmother
- > Anang Star
- Ojiig Fisher, Big Dipper/Ursa Major
- ➤ Jiibay-miikana Spirit Path, Milky Way
- ➤ Maang Loon, little dipper
- ➤ Madoodiswan Sweat Lodge, Corona borealis
- ➤ Bagonegiizhig Hole in the Sky, Pleiades/7 sisters




Gaa-Miskwaabikaang – "the place where there is red rock cliffs." Miskwaabikaang is the center of the Anishinaabeg nation and is endearingly called "Hub of the Ojibwe Nation." It is at the further most point in the state of Wisconsin overlooking the Apostle Islands. There are roughly 1,200 members living on the reservation, about 575 living in Bayfield County and close to 5,850 living outside of Bayfield County.



Frog Bay Tribal National Park (FBTNP) is the first tribal national park in the united states.

FBTNP celebrates the cultural importance of water and spirituality that is associated with Lake Superior.

The park protects 300 acres, consisting of: a large tract of at-risk boreal forest, over a mile of riparian corridor, nearly 120 acres of wetlands and freshwater estuary habitat. The almost 4,000 feet of undeveloped shoreline with a view of Oak Island, one of the Apostle Islands is a must see!



Mooniingwanekaaning-minis (Madeline Island), in some of our Anishinaabeg stories, refers to the very place that the first Anishinaabeg were placed. Making this area/location even more significant spiritually and culturally.

There are many relationships that we have with the night sky...there are just as many stories, and different variations depending on the location geographically and in each area, every family will have a different spin.

Waawaate, Aurora borealis.
When Jiibayag niimi'idiwag (spirits/ghosts dancing) across the night sky, known as Waawaate, the spirits of our ancestors are said to be dancing and rejoicing with spirits that have recently walked on.
Sometimes we can see spirits in Waawaate, animals, trees, clan animals, the face of a loved one that has walked on. All said to be delivering the viewer a message.

They will meet up and dance along Jiibay-miikana (The Spirit Path), also known as the Milky Way and through Bagonegiizhig (hole in the sky), to the Spirit World.

Bagonegiizhig is also known as the 7 sisters/Pleiades. There are many sacred stories that talk about just Bagonegiizhig.
